# Selected Response

Selected response is:

- An assessment where responses are mostly provided for the student or consist of short phrases.
- Not student generated and have one correct response.
- Can assess limited complexity or reasoning.
- Covers lots of content in an efficient way.

# What type of learning targets are best assessed using selected response?

- Knowledge targets
  - Facts
  - Definitions
  - Algorithms
  - Formulas
- Some reasoning targets
  - Needs to be a new context for student
  - Can include comparison, inference, best choice, etc.

# How do we plan for selected response assessment?

- Identify learning targets
- Prioritize learning targets
- Create a test plan
- Assign weight to each targeted area

# Assessment for Learning with Selected Response

- Identify the learning targets on the test and ask students to reflect on answers (page 162)
- Ask students to predict success on answers before turning in the test and then analyze results compared with predictions.
- Ask students to set goals after tests.
