Announcing Driver's Education Endorsement Courses via the ICN

As a result of recent changes approved by the Board of Educational Examiners, teachers may now earn the Driver Education (7-12) Endorsement by completing nine semester hours of credit that includes course work in accident prevention, drug and alcohol abuse, vehicle safety, and behind-the-wheel driving. For licensed secondary teachers, completion of the courses below authorizes both the classroom and behind-the-wheel driving. Courses will be taught via the ICN, with in-car and in-class experiences arranged in both the fall and spring semesters.
