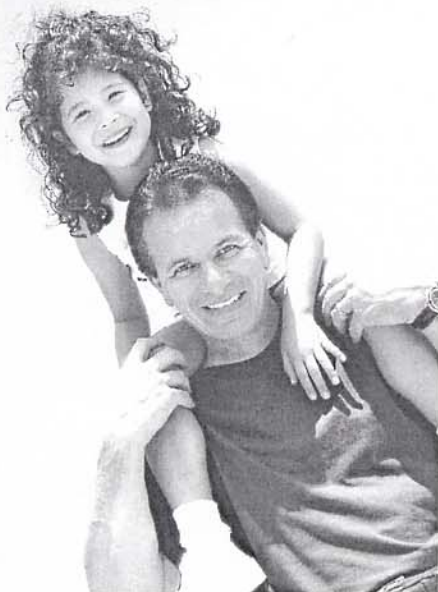


NAMI VISIONS FOR TOMORROW EDUCATION COURSE



For Parents and Caregivers of Children and Adolescents with Brain Disorders

ADD/ADHD, PDD/Autism, Tourette's Disorder, Conduct Disorder, Bipolar Disorder, Depressive Disorder, Eating Disorders, Anxiety Disorders Obsessive-Compulsive, Post Traumatic Stress, Separation Anxiety, Panic, Phobia, Generalize Anxiety, or Early Onset Schizophrenia Schizo-affective disorder.

This 10-week course is designed for parents, foster parents, respite care providers, grandparents and others who are raising children or adolescents who have brain disorders, also known as serious emotional disorders, or mental illness or who are presenting challenging behaviors that are likely to result in a mental health diagnosis. The program includes information about these mental illnesses and how they affect both family members and the person with the illness. The classes are taught by trained family members of children or adolescents with one or more of these mental illnesses. **All materials are furnished at no cost to the participant.** NAMI Iowa and NAMI Scott County are sponsors for the Visions for Tomorrow program.
